Course Description:

Congratulations on choosing Choral music and welcome! In this course, you will be presented with many opportunities to discover and enhance your skills as a performance, listener and composer.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there are restrictions in relation to the delivery of the Choral Music program. All performance related activities (including vocal) will have to be submitted from home. In school rehearsals will focus on non-performance tasks, such as music theory, rhythm comprehension, performance analysis and music technology.

Course Objectives and Assessment:

Choral music is a performance-based program and, as such, the learning environment must be conducive to creativity and risk-taking. Students are expected to contribute a positive attitude and a consistent work ethic. The key components of this group-based activity are regular, punctual attendance along with an emotionally/socially supportive and trusting environment. Students are expected to contribute to that environment through positive participation, positive attitude and mutual respect and support of one another, their teachers and the facility.

Over the course of the 2020-2021 school year, Nelson Mandela High School teachers will maintain an online course presence containing materials, resources, assignments and supports through our D2L environment. It is important for students to take an active role in their learning and stay current in their schoolwork if away for any reason.
